



Covert Entry Vulnerability Assessment

Purpose: This kit allows security teams to test how easily an unauthorized individual could enter a facility, posing as a legitimate presence. It helps measure awareness, enforcement, and response consistency.

1. PREPARATION

Select a Test Scenario:

- Tailgating behind a badge holder
- Unauthorized badge use (real or fake)
- Contractor with clipboard but no badge
- Person dressed in vendor gear (FedEx, cleaning staff)
- Confidence-based walk-in (no explanation given)

3. POST-ATTEMPT DEBRIEF

Score	Rating	Interpretation	Recommended Action
5	Exceptional	Response was timely, consistent, and aligned with SOPs. Staff showed high vigilance without prompting.	Use as a model for other teams. Consider peer training or advanced scenario drills.
4	Strong	Minor gaps in timing or communication, but threat was identified and handled effectively.	Reinforce with quarterly refreshers and no-notice testing.
3	Adequate	Threat was detected eventually, but only after missed cues or unclear handoffs.	Conduct targeted retraining and reinforce escalation roles.
2	At Risk	Threat was not identified or was allowed access for a period of time. SOPs were unclear or ignored.	Revisit SOPs, retrain staff, and repeat test within 30 days. Consider external evaluation.
1	Critical Gap	No detection or response. Breach occurred with full access. Personnel unaware or untrained.	Immediate remediation needed. Engage Averitas and initiate full readiness audit.

Total Score	Status	Interpretation	Action Recommendation
17–20	Operationally Ready	Systems are performing well under stress. Minor adjustments may improve further.	Continue testing monthly. Use this team as a model.
13–16	Moderate Risk	Gaps exist under real-world conditions. Response may be delayed or inconsistent.	Reinforce weak points. Schedule next covert test in 14 days.
9–12	High Risk	Teams are struggling with execution, awareness, or consistency.	Immediate retraining and SOP reinforcement recommended. Highly encouraged to consult Averitas.
4–8	Critical Breakdown	Threats go undetected. No trust in current response posture.	Engage Averitas immediately for full readiness audit.
